CITY COUNCIL MUSINGS

Yep, it's June. Time does fly doesn't it? Your City Council has been busy. Shades of the silly council appear every now and again. The General Assembly restored some of the transportation funding to the budget and our share increased. The council found a way to spend it so fast that you needed 3D glasses to watch it. The scary part about it is, to me, for programs and people. These will be ongoing costs to the City. They will have to continue to be funded and will develop into an ongoing expense to future budgets. Some of these proposed programs set a precedent for expansion and duplication of existing state and county programs, which we are already paying for.

Every other government is not giving employees raises. College Park is. This is not to say that some raise is not merited. However, it will come back in setting a new base when the next budget has to be decided. Is College Park really in such good financial shape that we can ignore national trends?

We are fortunate to have a group of citizens who are working to come up with a redistricting plan as a result of the census and our own charter requirement. They have addressed some difficult questions about new construction of the "off campus dorms".

Those who sent out the postcard to some voters in College Park now have come forward and identified themselves. A group of citizens have circulated a letter to inform you about the possible effects of

these referendum questions on the future of the government of our fair city. There are also directions on how you can withdraw your name from a signed petition.

There have been some dramatic changes to the council meetings on the cable TV. Tune it in and notice the difference. This brings to mind the availability of streaming and other upgrades that I personally don't understand. You can call the city and they will explain it to you in "geek" talk.

The city is in constant contact with PEPCO about street lights. If you have a light problem, call PEPCO. Remember the squeaky wheel - it is no different today except a computer prints a report.

By the time you read this the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life in Catonsville, which my family supports, will have taken place. If you have contributed in the past, you have received a note and a thank you. I personally thank you! 

Roasted Asparagus with Fresh Tarragon


Ingredients

- 1 pound fresh medium asparagus
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1 tsp. Dijon mustard
- 1 Tbsp. freshly squeezed lemon juice
(or to taste)
- 1 Tbsp. eschalots (or to taste)
- ¼ tsp. each salt and pepper
- ½ tsp. grated lemon peel
- 1 Tbsp. fresh tarragon, chopped.

Directions

Preheat oven to 425°f. Snap tough ends off asparagus. Cut spears on the diagonal, into 2 inch lengths.

Mix oil, mustard, lemon juice & peel, eschalots, salt and pepper and tarragon together, coat asparagus. Transfer to shallow baking pan to hold a single layer of asparagus. Roast 6-8 minutes until crisp-tender. Serve hot or room temperature.

As a reminder, an e-mail is sent to all Board members on the next business day.

Once completed, the newsletter is submitted to the BDCA President for final approval. The final, approved newsletter is e-mailed to the printer not later than the 2nd Thursday of the month.

On the 1st of every month the general membership is invited to submit articles, and 1 accompanying photograph for publication. All articles must adhere to the following conditions for publication:

- Articles should be in MS Word format and not exceed 1 pages, single spaced, in Verdana font, with a font size of 9.5.
- Articles capturing the history of our Berwyn neighborhood, community affairs, human interest, family recipes and traditions will be considered.
- Articles and photographs expressing a political, religious or social philosophy will not be accepted.
- The Editor reserves the right to decline articles, and or photographs, for any reason.
